Since 1990, CornerHouse has taught other professionals how to use the RATAAC® forensic interview protocol to elicit statements from children in a way that is developmentally appropriate, non-leading, and ensures the rights of the accused. To date, CornerHouse has trained over 17,000 individuals who have come from 48 states as well as American Samoa, Canada, Columbia, Jamaica, Japan, Kosovo, The Netherlands, and Uruguay seeking forensically sound methods of interviewing children. Trainees report that CornerHouse training is, "...by far the best training [they] have ever attended..."

CornerHouse Renovation

On Tuesday October 16, 2007, CornerHouse held an Open House to celebrate the successful completion of a major renovation project. The project involved replacing carpet

throughout the entire building - over 8000 square feet. Additionally, doors, walls, plumbing and electrical outlets were moved. Earlier this spring insulation and ventilation were added to the attic to reduce heat loss and ice dams.

Sadly, of course, child abuse did not slow down during the period of renovation and CornerHouse needed to continue to conduct forensic interviews during the project. This was made possible by the generous donation of office space by Children's Hospitals and Clinics in the Medical Office Building in the 2500 block of Chicago Ave., Minneapolis. During August, CornerHouse staff moved videotaping equipment and furniture to the Children's suite of offices and conducted forensic interviews at this location. When the project was complete, staff returned the equipment and furniture to CornerHouse. In addition to the renovated space, CornerHouse was the recipient of a generous donation of framed artwork and newly painted office and common area walls.

The completion of the project culminated upgrades begun last year with the purchase of completely new training room furniture.

At the Open House, Executive Director Tom Frost thanked Lana Weber, project team leader, and others, including staff, for the vision, energy and commitment that made the project possible.
