- A process to critically assess your own or others' forensic interview practice through participation in a peer review process

Structure

- In-person training for 2 days in your location
 - One-day day option available as a supplemental to other on-site trainings.
- Class size limited to 30 learners
- Highly interactive training includes lecture and discussion, viewing of video-recorded interviews, skill-building exercises, and role plays
- All trainers are experienced forensic interviewers

Who?

 - Have conducted a minimum of 10 interviews (waived for prosecutors)
 - · Have completed forensic interview training between 2005-2012 including:
 - RATAC®, First Witness™, or ChildFirst™/Finding Words™
