Structure

- Eight hours of interactive online content available four weeks before in-person training
- In-person training that takes place over three days in Minneapolis
- Class size limited to 18 participants assuring a small, personal learning environment
- Active and experiential in-person training utilizes lecture, discussion, small groups, demonstration videos, and role playing lead by experienced forensic interviewers

Who?

- This training is appropriate for forensic interviewers, child protection workers, law enforcement staff, children's advocacy center personnel, and other multi-disciplinary team members who:
 - Are independent, self-motivated learners who are comfortable using technology and have access to a computer and high speed internet
 - Have conducted a minimum of 10 interviews (waived for prosecutors)
 - Have completed a basic forensic interviewing course
